A Letter From The Pastor

The watch party was to say thank you to our neighbors who keep an eye on the church when there are no events happening. It was also a great way to be a good neighbor.

The event is an excellent example of organic evangelism. Our goal with the watch party wasn't to "win souls for Jesus" or expand membership, it was to say thank you. This is evangelism. Reaching out to our neighbors, and the people in our communities and sharing a meal is one way we can reach out to those around us. It lets people know that we are a welcoming and vibrant church and that we love baseball.

Evangelism can be a scary thing. The idea of sharing our faith and potentially being judged is terrifying. But sharing a meal is so scary, watching a game isn't too terrifying. Organic evangelism is leading on our values, the things we care about, and connecting to others in our communities or our lives who care about the same things. Sometimes those values are ministry or justice oriented, like hunger, homelessness, or climate justice. But sometimes those values are about our love of community, food, and even baseball.

One venue of organic evangelism we do really well with is worship. By being welcoming and joyful in our worship together we have found great success with the visitors who come to us. Our values in worship, of being family oriented, graceful, and willing to laugh off the little things give people who are looking for a church home a reason to come back.

Sometimes evangelism is as easy as sharing what we value, and what we love, and letting the people who value and love those same things find us. We will need to do those things publicly, and maybe that's a little scary. But we will do them like we do worship, like we did the watch party, together.




